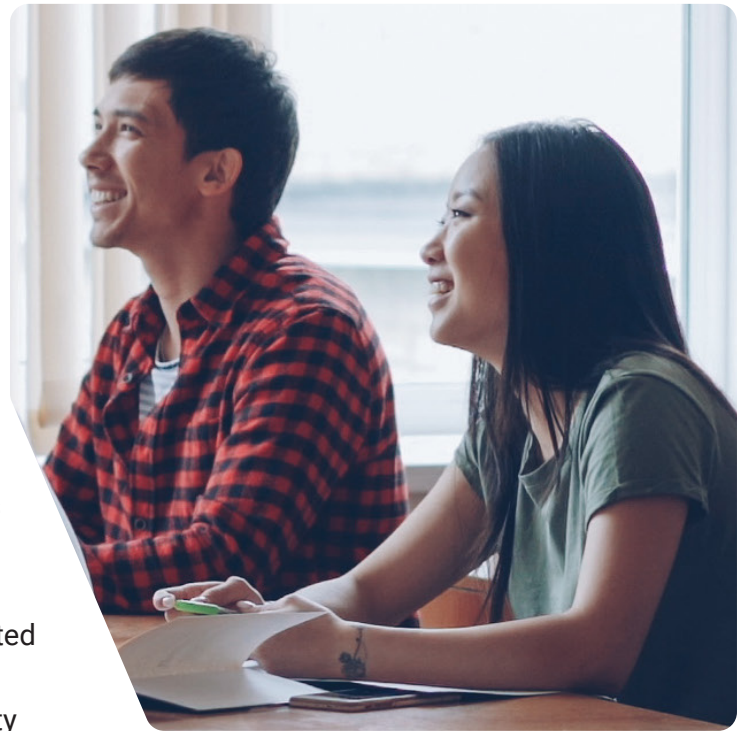


Using Aperian® in the Classroom: A Playbook for Professors

Aperian can be a powerful resource to introduce students to concepts related to cultural competency and inclusion. Below is an example of how **O. Volkan Ozbek, Ph.D.**, Professor, Texas A&M University - San Antonio, incorporated the GlobeSmart® Profile and GlobeSmart® Guides into his International Management course during his time at Trinity University's Michael Neidorff School of Business.



Aperian Learning Outcomes

- Assess and defend the importance of culture on the success of global business operations,
- Explain distinct characteristics of national cultures including how they help global managers better assess an international setting,
- Understand the critical impact of effective cross-cultural communication on the global success of the firm,
- Identify and compare cultural practices of eight to ten countries, excluding the student's home country.

Required Activities

- Complete five Aperian learning modules
 - Giving Feedback Across Cultures
 - The GlobeSmart Dimensions and Inclusive Actions
 - Understanding the GlobeSmart Cultural Dimensions
 - Using the GlobeSmart Profile to Improve Teamwork
 - Why Culture Matters
- Complete eight to ten GlobeSmart Guide quizzes with a passing score (minimum of 80%)

Outline for the GlobeSmart Guide Quizzes

- Optional: Issue a Certificate of Achievement for completing eight to ten quizzes
- Instructions for Students:
